School Fencing & Gates

- ♦ The (staff carpark) main entrance to the school and the front school gate opening onto Cardo Drive will be the only gates open through the day.

- ♦ All gates other than the main carpark and front gate onto Cardo Drive will be **locked at 3.15pm**.



WORLD PEACE FLAME


Part of Education Week next Wednesday will be a ceremony where we light the World Peace Flame.


