Student Reports go home next Thursday 23 June . Parents/carers will have the opportunity to see how their child is performing at school through Student Led Conferences. The conferences will be held in your **child's classroom**. The Student Led Conference process is about students taking increased control over their own learning through setting learning goals, evaluating their work on a day-to-day basis and sharing what they have achieved with their parents.

During the Conference itself each child will:

- ◆ share with you the learning goals they set themselves for Term Two
- ◆ share and discuss selected samples of school work which they evaluated and collected this semester in their presentation folders
- ◆ possibly do a performance item e.g. read to you or show you their displayed classroom work
- ◆ discuss with you the setting of personal learning goals for the second semester

In any one classroom there may be up to three interviews being conducted at the one time. The teacher's role is to move around the room and provide assistance to students and parents where needed but NOT to lead the process. The whole purpose of these conferences is for **the student learner to take the leading role**.

If you have any concerns that you want to discuss with the teacher alone you can arrange a separate teacher/parent interview at a mutually convenient time. It is essential that all parents participate in the Student Led Conferences for it to be successful. If parents don't turn up the whole purpose of the activity is lost.

Kinder—Mrs Purss-Semple & Mrs Wells

Kindergarten are continuing to work hard everyday. In Maths we have been learning about length, using informal units, such as blocks, and we have been measuring a variety of classroom objects. We investigated how to compare the lengths of two objects by placing the objects side by side and aligning the ends. In our 'Safety' unit we are beginning to look at Road Safety. We will be learning how to keep safe on the roads and when being a passenger. Do you have a family treasure? In History over the next few weeks, we will be asking families to send in something that is special to their family. A note will be sent out next week to explain what and when these treasures will be needed. Keep up the good work!

Year K/1 (Bumble Bees)—Mrs Paterson & Ms Boughton

We hope you were able to come along and enjoy our 'hand clapping' item at the assembly today. We have been practising in class and it is harder than it looks—a great deal of concentration and hand/eye co-ordination is needed. We have been working hard in Maths, learning about position. We are using language such as behind, next to, in front, left, right, north, south to describe position. Our Fundamental Movement Skill is overarm throw at the moment and the students are becoming great throwers! Keep up the good work!

Year 1/2—Mrs Pontt & Mrs Webb

Welcome back from the long weekend. Year 2 enjoyed their second session of Backyard Rugby this week. The Murray High School leaders are doing a wonderful job teaching our children the skills involved and our children are actively participating. In Maths we are consolidating our learning of subtraction and addition. We are very excited to be learning our dance for our whole school concert which is coming up later this year.

Year 2—Mrs Brown & Mrs Braines

Year 2 have been working hard in all areas. In Art we have created some amazing stained glass windows. We have been writing Information Reports on our peers and looking at multiplication and direction in Maths. We like to welcome our new student Ben into our class and to our school. Year 3/4D—Mrs Doust

I hope everyone enjoyed a well deserved long weekend—it has been a busy term. In Maths this week we are working on multiplication. Year 3 are focusing on 2x, 5x, and 10x tables and Year 4 are focusing on 3x and 5x tables. It is great to see the improvement since the start of the term. Our reading groups are working hard on inferring and predicting and our Grammar focus has been on homonyms/homophones.

Year 3/4S—Mrs Sloan

Year 3/4 have been having a fantastic term. We have been studying Wassily Kandisky in Art and we have created some wonderful abstract artworks. In Maths we have continued to improve our time table recall and have been looking at area and angles. With the cold weather here please remember to bring a jumper or jacket to school each day, and write your name on them.

Year 5/6C—Mrs Carroll

Our writing focus is on discussions which are similar to Writing Expositions. It just shows both sides of the arguments. Our class got to choose from a number of topics. In Maths our concept focus is chance and probability. We are thoroughly engaged in our novel study on the book "Once" by Morris Gleitzman. Our Fundamental Skill in PE last week was overarm throw. We played everyone for themselves, mastered the correct technique of the skill and finished with a game of bin throw. Our art projects are well under way and it's awesome to see the creativity throughout our class!

Year 5/6W—Miss Wilson

In class the students have chosen to research a convict, wealthy landowner, poor gold-pro prospector, bushranger, squatter and an Aboriginal drover. Students have been able to navigate the internet sites to locate information, to understand what life was like for their character. In Maths we have focused on fractions, decimals, percentages and chance over the fortnight. The students have seen the connections between the concepts. We are writing discussions and looking at both sides of a discussion before providing the recommendation.

Our library offers a large variety of texts to choose from and it is great to see so many students browsing the shelves weekly and enjoying their reading. 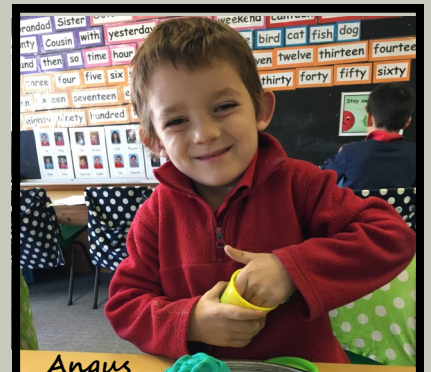

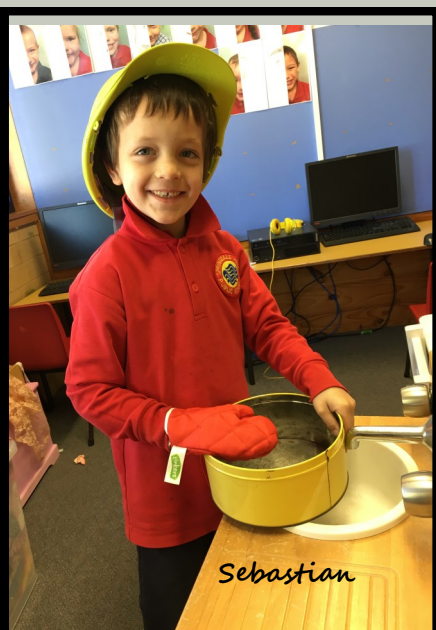
