Congratulations to our new leaders on being elected by their peers as responsible and committed members of our school. *Well done to you all!*

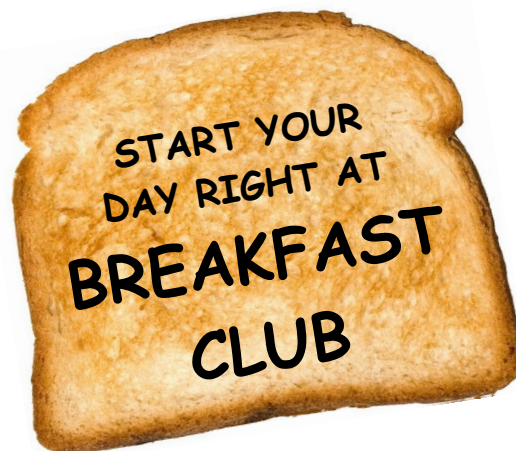
Lachlan has been elected as the new Blue House Sports Captain for Semester Two to replace the previous student who has now left our school. *Well done to you Lachlan!*

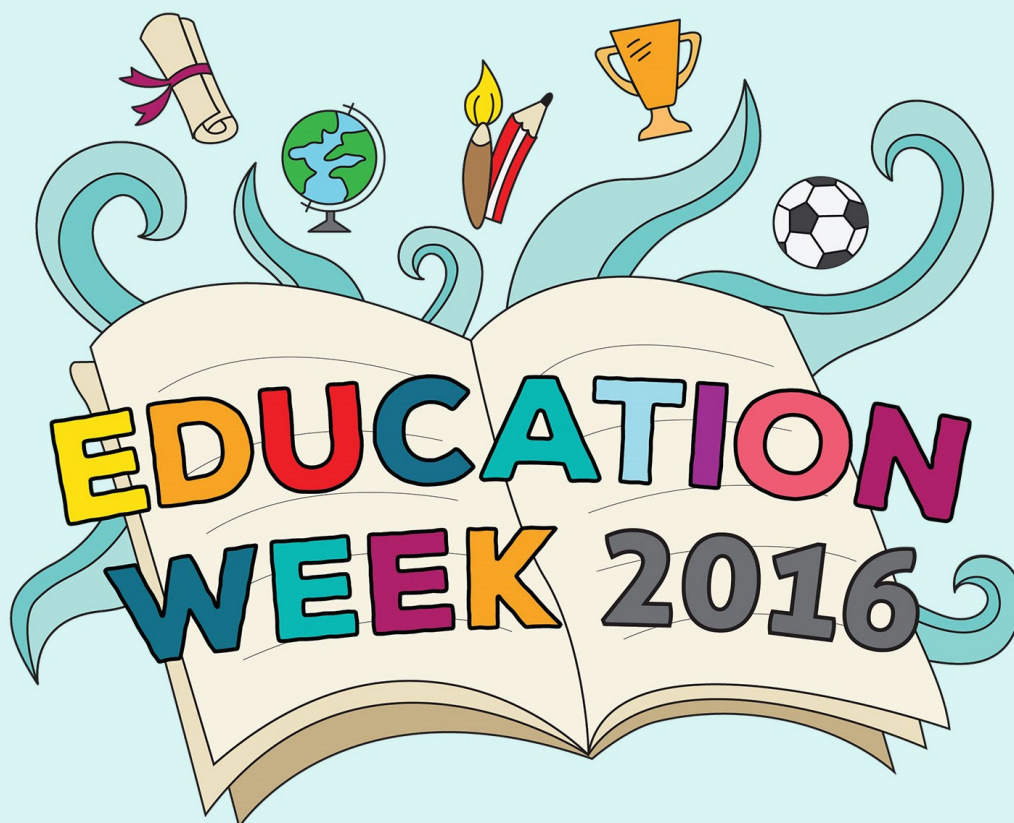

Kinder—Mrs Purss-Semple & Mrs Wells

Since the start of the year Kinder have been counting how many days we have been at school. Finally we reached 100 days of school on Tuesday 26 July. To celebrate we had a 100 day PARTY! Miss Heinjus cooked an amazing cake decorated with a Minion for each student in the class and the teachers. In addition to the party, students completed all sorts of fun Maths, Literacy and sporting activities throughout the day. We created a “This is what 100 looks like” wall. The wall shows a collection of bags each containing 100 items (eg; 100 cotton balls, 100 grains of rice, 100 popcorn). Year K/1 (Bumble Bees)—Mrs Paterson & Ms Boughton

We have had a busy start to the term with very enthusiastic learners. In Maths with Ms Boughton we are starting our measurement & geometry unit with 2D shapes. We started off with some great hands on learning tasks making flat shapes out of playdough, drawing shapes in glittered salt trays, shape puzzles and shape matching. K/1 also enjoyed the start of our music unit this term exploring timbre, tempo and dynamics.

Year 1/2—Mrs Pontt & Mrs Webb

Welcome to our busy Term 3. This term with Mrs Webb we will be looking at chemical changes in Science. Our Drama unit is based on the book “*Funny Bones*” and we will be exploring narratives as a text type. We will continue to look at place value and number patterns as well as begin multiplication and division in Maths.

Year 2—Mrs Brown & Mrs Hillary

It is going to be a very busy term. We are already preparing for our whole school performance in week 6. We are becoming great dancers and the whole class is really enjoying our item. In Writing we are focussing on making our stories more interesting using action verbs and adjectives while with Mrs Hillary we are revising other text types like procedure and information reports. In Maths we are focusing on whole number for the next two weeks.

Year 3/4D—Mrs Doust

This term is our whole school production and we are busily learning our dance. I will let you know a little later what costumes we need—they will be minimal. Our writing focus this term is information reports and we will be doing a project at home. This week in Maths we have been learning about lines and angles and next week, 2D shapes. We still have some children not completing their homework—could you please encourage your child to attempt it each week. It is important that each child reads for 10-15 minutes each night—we have new readers at school so I ask for your support in home reading too.

Year 3/4S—Mrs Sloan

Year 3/4 have gone straight into hard work. In Literacy we have started looking at information reports and where and how to best find reliable sources of information. In Maths we have been looking at fractions and we have also been playing some drama games to begin our drama unit. Preparations have started for our school production in week 6 which we are all very excited about.

Year 5/6C—Mrs Carroll

Welcome back to Term 3. We hope you enjoyed our assembly showcase of our Australian Art Museum from Term 1. All students worked really hard on their projects and should be very proud of their efforts! This term our HSIE unit is on Antarctica. Last week we created cartoon strips on the effects global warming has had in Antarctica and how changes in Antarctica can affect the rest of the world. We looked at a famous explorer Ernest Shackleton and his journey to Antarctica. In writing we wrote information reports on Ernest Shackleton’s life.

Year 5/6W—Miss Wilson

Everyone has been working hard on our Olympic project and we are all looking forward to the Olympics starting. We have started practising our whole school production item and the children are doing well. In Maths we have been focusing on 2D shapes and number strategies in addition and subtraction. Our Writing focus for the first half of the term is information report. The students are enjoying reading factual texts to locate information to write detailed reports.

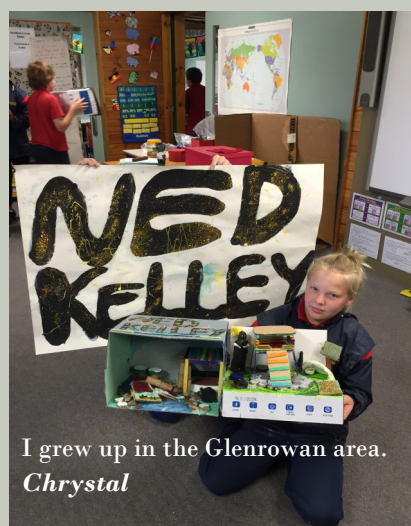

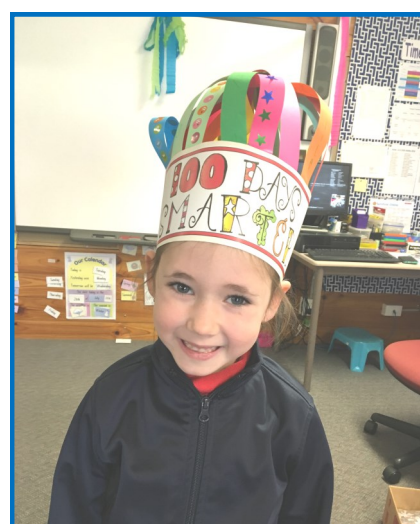
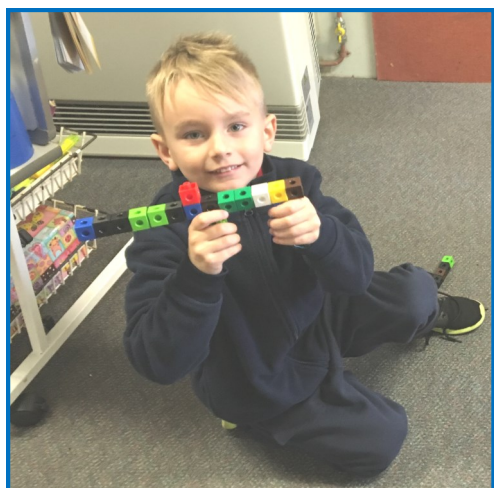
