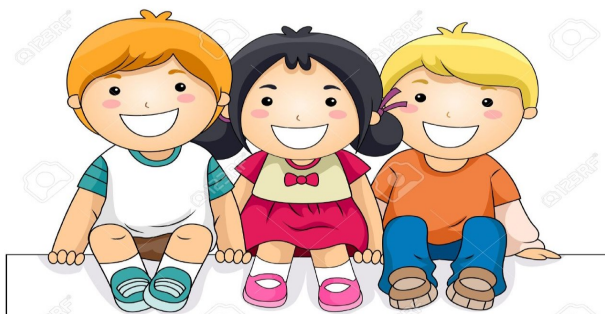

# 3-4D

## BLOBTRONS

3-4D have been focusing on Information Reports in their Writing Groups.

One task was to write an information report on a fictitious animal—a Blobtron which had to be related to a real animal.

Here are our reports for you to enjoy.

The Blobtron is related to the “AVE” family. The Blobtron has feathers, wings, a beak, lays eggs and is warm blooded. The Blobtron is born in a hard egg and it dies around the age of 65 years old. It stays with its parents for the first 5 years of its life. Blobtrons live in the high tree tops and eats its home away. When you see a Blobtron, you see bright pink, purple and aqua feathers. You also see a two centimetre beak which is bright pink. This Blobtron has three big eyes and it is three centimetres long. Blobtrons eats worms, insects, other Blobtrons, flies, seeds and leaves. They drink water. The Blobtron moves by flying and it flies at 33km through the air.

### **Brodie**

Did you know Blobtrons are pink blue and purple? Their eyes can be blue or gold. Blobtrons have long beaks, two big wings and two long legs. They are very pretty. Blobtrons are found in both Australia and New Zealand. They like to make nests out of rocks and leaves, they make the body out of rocks and the inner out of leaves. They are not found in India or America. Did you know they love eating other dead birds that have not been eaten? Their lunch is mostly worms and bugs. If a seed falls off a tree it will fly past and eat it and sometimes it would take food back to its nest. Blobtrons usually walk to their destination. Blobtrons would only fly on special occasions like escaping enemies. They only run when in a hurry to find food or if it's in a big race with other Blobtrons. If it is tired and not strong enough to fly, it jumps and they can jump very high. Did you know Blobtrons come from small eggs and when they hatch they are only blue? As they grow into chicks they are only blue and pink. They get their true colours by eating when they're adults. Blobtrons are related to birds. They have feathers, beaks and big wings. They lay

tiny purple eggs and their eggs are seven centimetres long and two centimetres wide and are two millimetres thick.

### **Allira**

Did you know that some Blobtrons live under rocks and in drain pipes? They can also live underground and in trees and they are good at camouflaging.

Blobtrons have two eyes the size of tractor tyres and they have curly arms and legs. Blobtrons can weigh up to one thousand kilograms and grow up to two metres high. They are able to change colour and camouflage with things. Blobtrons are marsupials as they have a pouch and feed their babies milk. A male Blobtron mates with a female and after ten weeks a baby Blobtron is born in the pouch. It lives in there for four weeks before it is out. They live for about forty years. Blobtrons mainly eat gum leaves but they

also eat bugs and snakes. Blobtrons mainly climb trees but they have been seen chasing quad bikes.

### **Ben**

Did you know some Blobtrons are classified as a mollusc? They have eight legs and are soft shelled. An octopus is also a mollusc. Blobtrons only live in Australia and they are only found in fresh water. They like to live in deep water and you can never find them on the ground. Most Blobtrons live between six months to five years and they hatch from a small, white egg. Did you know that Blobtrons eat prawns and fish and they also like plankton. Most Blobtrons are blue, pink and purple. They have a beak and two eyes the size of marbles. Blobtrons spend most of their time in water. They swim around and use their legs to swim in the water. They can change their shape really quickly to get out of the rocks or if they is stuck somewhere.

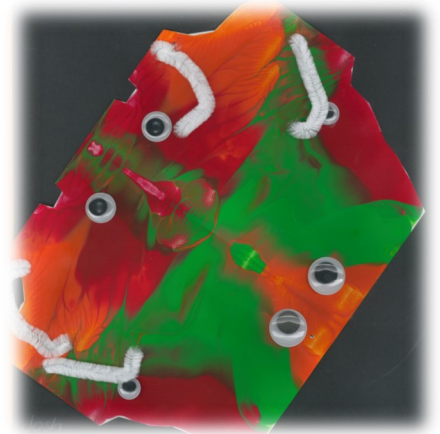
### **Charli**

Did you know Blobtrons only live in the Prime Minister's yard and they live in big trees. Blobtrons have four legs and two eyes. Blobtrons belong to the mammal family and they are covered in fur. They are herbivores - only eating grass and plants. A Blobtron can climb very quickly and it can run and jump high.

### **Jayden**

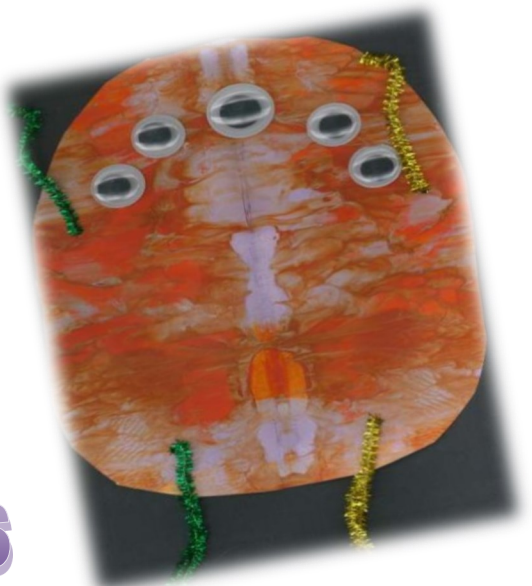
Did you know Blobtrons can run twenty kilometres per hour? Blobtrons are amphibians and are cold blooded. Blobtrons live on land, in oceans, in salt water and in fresh water. They can weigh up to 65g. Blobtrons only eat fish and insects. Did you know a Blobtron's egg is soft shelled. The eggs are buried under the sand and after two months they hatch.

### **Joshua**



Did you know Blobtrons live in Lavington? You can sometimes find them in caves of goo on top of Red Light Hill but they will never be found in water. Blobtrons can be seen on the ground running or they can be seen climbing up a tree. Blobtrons are orange and shiny purple. They have five eyes, one the size of a soccer ball and the others are the size of marbles. They have two arms with two sharp, dangling claws. Their two strong legs can carry their 40kg body and they are 30cm tall. Blobtrons run on the ground to find all sorts of food. They like nuts, seeds, conifer cones, fruits, fungi and green egetables. Did you know Blobtrons are born without hair? For the next 8-10 weeks they get fed by their mother's milk. They leave their mother when they're ten years old. Blobtrons are mammals and are closely related to the squirrel family.

# BLOBTRONS

Did you know Blobtrons live in trees, mountains and underground? A Blobtron is an ant - it has six legs, an antennae and a three part body. Blobtrons have claws and strong, sharp, bony jaws. They have strong wings and can grow up to ten metres long. Blobtrons eat bugs, arachnids and harvest meat off dead animals. The Blobtron queen lays the eggs and workers and soldiers hatch from the eggs. There are special eggs that hatch queens and kings. Did you know the queen lives for thirty years? A Blobtron runs very fast, flies quickly, climbs very sneakily and digs unnoticed.

## **Koby**

Did you know that Blobtrons only live at the Canberra zoo?

Blobtrons are blue and green and they can weigh up to one thousand kilograms. They have two legs and two arms. Blobtrons eat insects, bananas, carrots, broccoli and lots of stuff. The Blobtron is related to the ape family so it is a mammal. It is born alive as a baby Blobtron and ten years later it's a kid and twenty years later it's a dad or mum. Blobtrons crawl quickly but swim really slowly because of their weight.

## **Maddex**

Blobtrons are found in the Blue Mountains and they are found on the smallest mountain. They live under leaves and rocks for shelter. Blobtrons are born alive and they feed off their mother for less than two months before the mother leaves them. They are warm blooded and belong to the mammal family. They look like goats, covered in fur with colours of blue, pink and purple.

They grow to one metre high and can weigh fifty kilos. Blobtrons find their own food after the mother leaves and they find a new home on the mountains. Blobtrons only come out at night time. Blobtrons eat grass, hay and grain and drink water. Blobtrons have four legs and start walking at a month old.

## **Marlee**

Did you know Blobtrons are found all around Australia? They live everywhere – in the bush, in trees and in houses. Blobtrons are a spider, a member of the arachnid family. Blobtrons have eight legs and eight eyes. They are blue, pink and purple and have a red mouth. Blobtrons hatch out of eggs and grow to full

size when they are ten weeks old. “Phoenix, did you know that Blobtrons live in the corners of all houses in Australia?” A Blobtron is a huntsman spider. It's an arachnid and it has eight eyes. Blobtrons are red, green and blue. Blobtrons move quickly, bite quickly and crawl quickly. Blobtrons eat insects, bugs, other spiders and flies. Blobtrons hatch from eggs and baby Blobtrons are called spiderlings.

## **Rhys**

Did you know Blobtrons only live on Red Light Hill in great, big tree tops and they are only found in Australia? The Blobtron is almost extinct and is hard to find. A Blobtron is a bird because it's got wings, feathers and can fly. Blobtrons are an Ave, they

are warm blooded and lay eggs and have long, black beaks. A Blobtron usually eats worms, insects, mud, frogs, seeds, and bread. The reason they like bread is because they split it into little crumbs. A Blobtron has purple and blue feathers with a little bit of pink on them. A Blobtron can grow up to 22cm tall and can weigh up to 23 grams. Blobtrons are born in a blue, purple and pink egg and they stay with their mother for two years. Did you know that they don't have feathers until it leaves its mother? A Blobtron can fly up to 22 kilometres an hour. A Blobtron can walk and can glide above trees in forests and they travel all around Red Light Hill.

## **Sandy**

Did you know some Blobtrons are classified as fish? They have scales, fins and gills and they breathe under water. Blobtrons live

in Australia and they are found in fresh water. The water must be ten metres deep! Did you know some Blobtrons can be pink, light blue and purple and that they can grow up to two metres long and weigh up to five hundred grams? Did you know some Blobtrons hatch from eggs? They hatch from eggs after seven weeks in the egg. Blobtrons swim around to find their food and their fins help the Blobtron to steer away from things. They eat frogs, tadpoles, yabbies, fish and algae.

## **Charlotte**





Blobtrons live in Springdale Heights and Hamilton Valley only. They live under leaves that fall from the trees. Blobtrons are rough, green and purple. They have four legs and two arms with two big googly eyes. Their skin is hard like concrete. They eat flower stems, bark and stones and that is how they get their rough, concrete like skin. Did you know Blobtrons are mammals so they are born alive? When they are born they travel around with their mother and father to find food and shelter that suits the whole family. Blobtrons feed off their mums until their mothers leave them, after three months. They are warm blooded and after twelve years the life cycle begins again. There are different breeds of Blobtrons which mean they are all different colours. There are pink, purple and blue Blobtrons. They hop like a wallaby and they also do a bear walk.

#### **Violet**

Blobtrons can only be found in Australia. Blobtrons are creatures that can be found on hill tops and in caves. Be careful when walking around near a Blobtron's habitat. Blobtrons have one eye, four legs, are covered in scales and have two short tails. They can grow up to forty two centimetres long and their skin colour is a reddish orange. Blobtrons are kind of translucent and their skeleton is visible from the outside. Blobtrons are related to Komodo Dragons. Blobtrons eat insects, small mammals, fish and spiders and they even eat birds. Blobtrons are born from eggs. Blobtrons dig holes and lay up to seven eggs in a nest of sticks and grass. They are on their own the day they hatch. Blobtrons sprint with caution and can jump up to a metre high.

#### **Will**

Did you know Blobtrons are only found in the top of big gum trees in Hobart, Tasmania? Blobtrons eat flies, bark, grass and eucalyptus leaves. They drink water and sap. Blobtrons are big arachnids. They have small legs called palps next to their fangs. Blobtrons are 9cm long and 12 cm wide. They weigh around 25g. They have eight eyes and they are very venomous. They are bright orange with purple hair on their legs. Blobtrons are fed for two months before leaving their mother.

Blobtrons can crawl up to one metre without stopping for a break.

#### **Talyn**

Blobtrons are found in tree tops in Australia. Did you know Blobtrons live in some zoos in Australia? Blobtrons can live in water and in bushes. A Blobtron is a part of the Ave family. It has pink, purple and blue feathers. Blobtrons have oval shaped wings and a tiny beak. Blobtrons lay pink eggs with blue dots and are warm blooded. They are 9cm tall when fully grown and can weigh up to 22 grams. Blobtrons eat a few things like worms and seeds and they drink water. Did you know they eat insects and frogs? Blobtrons hatch from pink eggs with blue dots and they don't have feathers when they hatch. They stay with their mother for four years. Blobtrons can move in many different ways - they can fly or walk. Did you know Blobtrons can glide? They fly to warm places when it is cold and they can fly up to 22 km an hour.

#### **Tiana**

Did you know Blobtrons are a very rare animal? They are only found under the bed of a girl with the biggest heart. There are many different types of Blobtrons but most Blobtrons are pink, purple and blue and they have wings and little legs. Blobtrons are born as a caterpillar from a cocoon and then turn into a butterfly, so they are part of the butterfly family. Blobtrons drink nectar from flowers with their long tongue. Blobtrons move by flying and walking. So if you are a girl with a big heart, look under your bed and you might find a Blobtron!

#### **Tylah**

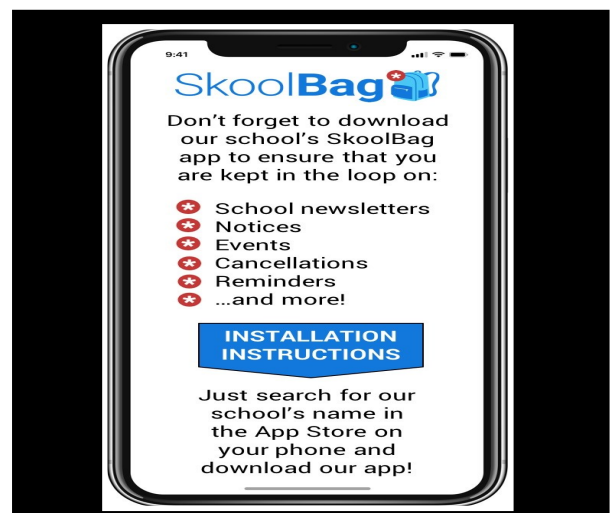
Did you know Blobtrons live in Australia on the beach? They live in palm trees near the sand. A Blobtron is a type of bird; they have feathers and two wings. Did you know Blobtrons have yellow feet and two eyes? They are symmetrical and they have red, purple and green feathers.

Did you know Blobtrons come from eggs? When Blobtrons are eleven they are adults. Blobtrons eat stink bugs but they normally eat worms. A Blobtron's movement is flying really fast and they can go up to 60km an hour using their wings.

#### **Blair**

Did you know Blobtrons are only found in Australia and live in gum trees. Blobtrons are mammals they are covered in fur and Blobtrons have pouches so they are marsupials. Blobtrons are purple, pink and green they are 30cm tall. They are warm blooded and have sharp teeth and claws. Blobtrons have two eyes and four legs. Blobtrons are very fast animals and they climb trees using their sharp claws. Blobtrons are born alive with no fur but two weeks later they will have fur. Their diet is berries and gum leaves and they are herbivores.
