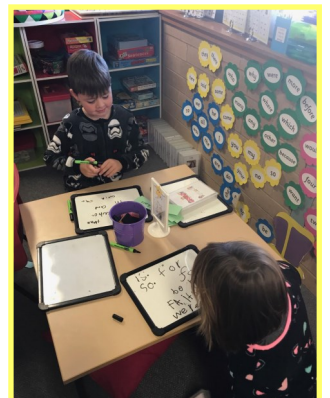

AFL North Melbourne Visitors

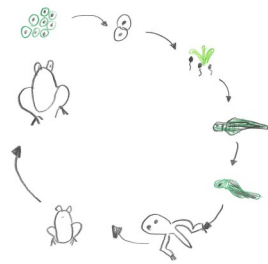

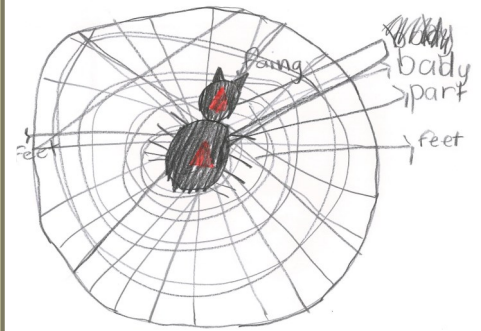


In Year 1-2 P we have been learning about *Information Texts* in class. We have read lots of factual books and watched some factual videos.

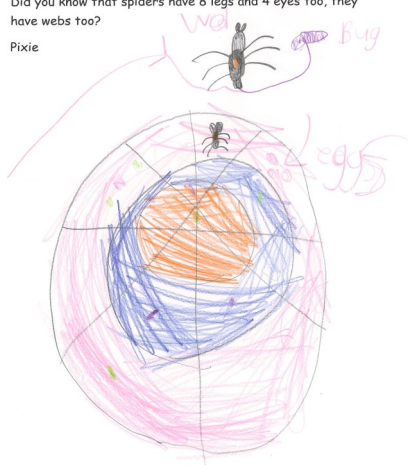

Did you know that spiders have 8 legs and 4 eyes too, they have webs too?

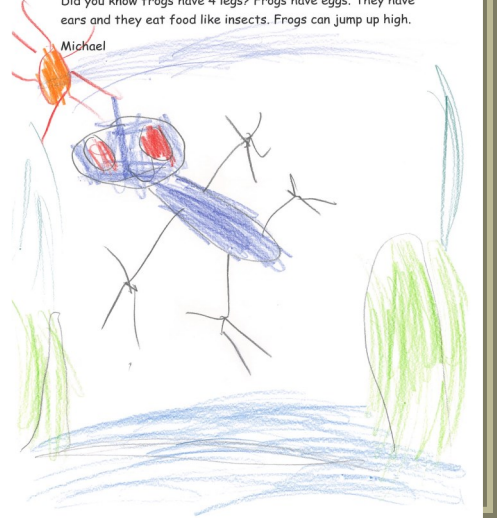

Did you know frogs have 4 legs? Frogs have eggs. They have ears and they eat food like insects. Frogs can jump up high.

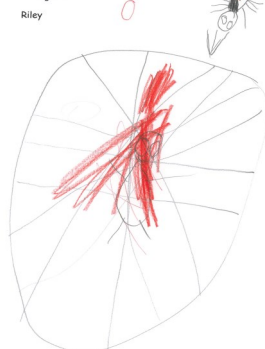

Did you know that some spiders are poisonous? Spiders have strong webs.

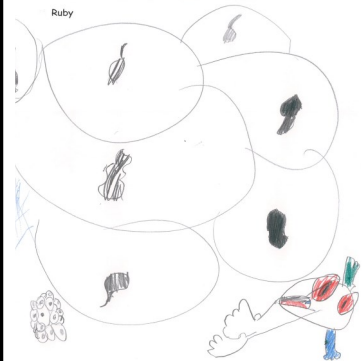

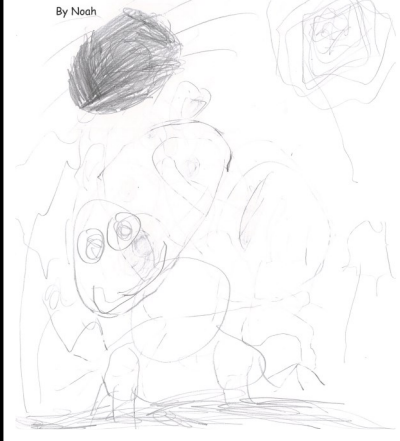

Did you know caterpillars have no noses at all? Why? Because they have little breathing holes near where their legs are and they don't just have that they also have 6 legs and the rest are hooks.

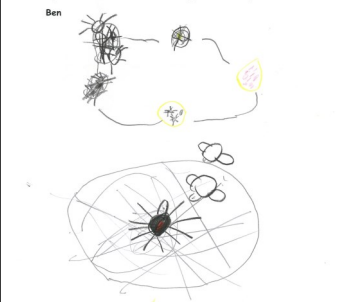

Did you know that spiders have poisonous fangs? They eat bugs and they have 8 eyes and strong webs.

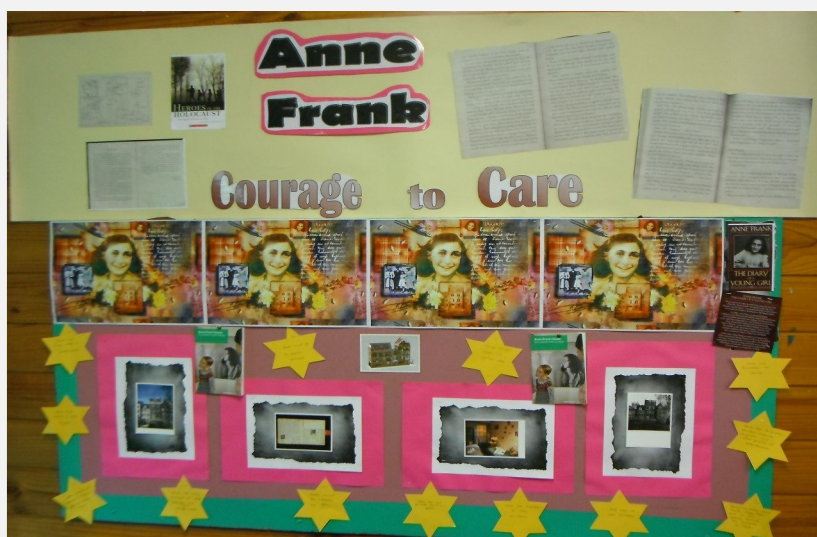
