## Wirraminna—Thursday 7 November

**Class 1-2** students will be travelling to Wirraminna Environmental Education Centre (at Burrumbuttock) for a day of Environmental Studies. The purpose of our visit is to use the facilities at Wirraminna to learn about our natural Australian environment, Australian Flora and Fauna. The excursion has strong connections to many aspects of the curriculum.

**Cost:** \$5—Payment of \$10 is due by Tuesday 5 November

**Travel:** By bus

**Times:** Leave school at 9.10 am and return by 2.45 pm

**Requirements:** Students will need to take their own **recess** and **lunch** to Wirraminna with minimal rubbish please. Students will also need a (water) drink, as there is limited fresh drinking water available. Students **MUST WEAR SCHOOL UNIFORM** including a jumper or jacket and **SENSIBLE FOOTWEAR** on the day.

## Wagga Zoo—Fri 8 Nov

Students in Kinder and Year 1 have the opportunity to go on an excursion to Wagga Wagga Zoo and Aviary at the Botanical Gardens on Friday 8 November 2019. Ms Boughton and Mrs Cheadle have been busy organising an educational and fun day out for the children with the excursion covering their current Science unit on Living Things. We will be investigating the needs of the animals and observing their habitats.

The cost of the excursion includes bus travel to Wagga Wagga (seat belted bus), entry to Botanic Gardens, Mini Zoo and the adventure playground.

**Cost:** \$10 per student

**What to bring:** A picnic recess and lunch are planned in the gardens and students will need to pack food for both recess and lunch and plenty of water to drink for the day.

**What to wear:** Students must be in full summer school uniform and must have a school hat. We will be applying sunscreen throughout the day.  
The bus will leave the school at 9.05 am and return at 2.55 pm.

## Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and Scienceworks Excursion

On **Wednesday 27 November**, Years 5 & 6 have an excursion to the very popular musical Charlie and the Chocolate Factory has come to Melbourne and we are fortunate to have booked and paid for tickets. 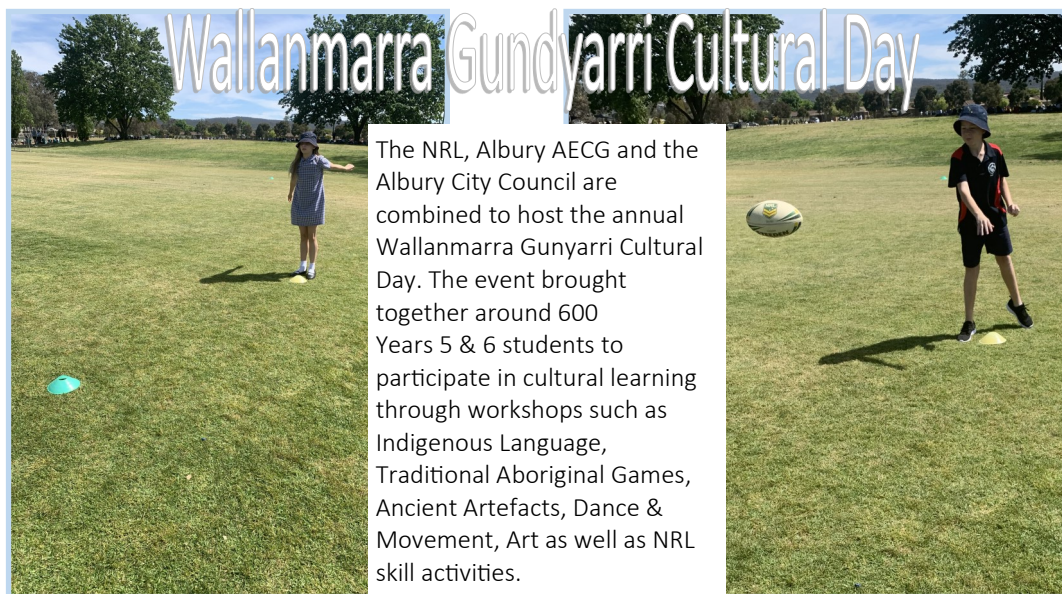
### **When and Where ...**
